From the Desk of the Chief Editor

Fifty Years of Dibrugarh University

ibrugarh University has completed fifty years and jubilee celebrations are going on. The journey so far has not always been smooth, easy and happy. The barriers before the builders of the University were high but they were broken by the determined will of the architects. Fifty years is not a very long period in the history of a University but in five decades things can change beyond recognition. One who visits the University today for the first time will not be able to guess what the University campus looked like in the sixties, seventies and eighties of the last century. Today a pedestrian has to wait at least a few minutes to cross the highway in front of the University gate because of traffic but the same highway three decades ago was dark and deserted in the evening. The stretch of road from the University campus to Amolapatty in the evening would submerge in darkness as there were no streetlights.

The in-campus changes in the fifty years are spectacular. In 1965 the University started functioning with a cluster of tin-roofed houses which used to be the tea house, Manager's bunglow and other houses of the tea garden which was transformed to the University. The first batch of the University community worked really hard in most uncompromising physical conditions. The campus today wears a different look. With two storeyed R.C.C. buildings for the Post-Graduate Departments and the Centres for Study, a massive administrative building, multistoreyed central LNB Library, hostels, the Vice-Chancellor's office, a healthy looking health centre, a beautiful recreational park reflecting the cultural heritage of Assam, smooth pitch-roads connecting each building with the rest of the campus and the soothing natural surroundings, The Dibrugarh University campus today is just splendid. Along with the physical growth, the University has also shaped the educational, cultural and intellectual life of this region of the country in the fifty years. Teaching and research acquaint students and researchers with what is best thought and known in the world and at the same time make fresh insights into the cultural life of the people in the region and the needs of the industries located in this part of the country.



In Conversation with Prof. K. V. S. RAO

Prof. Kanury Venkata Subba Rao, Research Group Leader, International Centre for Genetic Engineering and Biotechnology (ICGEB), New Delhi visited Dibrugarh University on March 11, 2015 to grace the Inaugural Session of the International Conference on 'Harnessing the sub-Himalayan Plant Diversity for Human Welfare' and the 4th Indian National Seminar of ANRAP on 'Plants in Diabetes-Prospects and Challenges' as Chief Guest. Prof. K. V. S. Rao is involved with ground-breaking research in different facets of Immunology and Microbiology. He received global fame when his lab became the first in the world to manually complete a genome-wide RNAi screening for detection of critical proteins necessary for the progression of Tuberculosis. Ms Amrita Kashyap Chaliha who is an Assistant Professor at the Centre for Studies in Biotechnology engaged Professor Rao, a Shanti Swarup Bhatnagar awardee in an engrossing dialogue during his stay on the campus. Following is an excerpt of the interview.

AKC: What motivated you to study Science?

KVS: I am actually an accidental Scientist-I wanted to be many things, chief of them a playwright or a writer first. But once I got into Science, it was fun. There is really no profession like it. Scientists are some of the only people who get paid for having a childlike curiosity and playing with ideas. And once you are in it, you can't come out of it.





AKC: You had your foundation in Chemistry right up to your doctoral degree- and even at John Hopkins Institute, in the USA, you did your Post-doctoral research in Environmental Chemistry. What prompted you to take a plunge in Biology?

KVS: I was at the Department of Environmental Chemistry at the John Hopkins Institute, but my post-doctoral research was on Synthetic Chemistry. We were working on the synthesis of melanin pigments. I started peptide synthesis at the University of California at Los Angeles (UCLA), and followed it up in my lab later at the International Centre for Genetic Engineering and Biotechnology, New Delhi.

At the College-level, Biology was mostly about dissecting frogs and cockroaches to learn about their anatomy- and I did not enjoy it. But there was also no conceptual development in Chemistry for the last fifty years-people were just mostly making modifications to known chemicals. It was when I was in John Hopkins Institute- where research was going on the chemical synthesis of a biological compound that I began to find Biology interesting. I became particularly interested in the growth factors and wrote to a few leading scientists working in that field- and that is the greatness of America- they did not care that I did not have education in Biology for a background. All of them liked what I wrote, and offered me positions in their research teams. Los Angeles sounded exciting, so I moved to the Molecular Biology Institute at the University of California at Los Angeles (UCLA).

AKC: Would you please give us a briefing on your current research work?

KVS: For the last four years, we have been working on Tuberculosis (TB) - mostly from a systems point of view- to understand the various adaptation mechanisms of the bacteria inside the infected cells. We actually did a genomewide RNAi screen to this effect- and we did it manually. And this went on to become a world record as we went on



to beat Harvard, Berkeley, Korea... everyone in competition for doing it first. And it was also fun. We wanted to know which proteins in the macrophage (a special kind of cell in our body) are exploited by the mycobacteria to support its survival. The only way we could do it was to knock down genes systematically in an infected macrophage and see how it affected mycobacterial growth. So we bought this genome wide RNAi library, and we targeted about 18,200 genes. We infected macrophages with Mycobacterium tuberculosis H37Rv strain, and silenced the genes one by one-lysing it at the end to perform a count of the live mycobacteria in it. It was challenging work too as we had to first get the infrastructure for it. I applied to the Department of Biotechnology (DBT), Government of India, for the project, and despite the cynicism of the Chairperson of the Review Committee, I was still granted the money as I stood firm in my words-'The chance of failure should never be a reason of concern- the fear of not trying because of the chance of failure should be'. The money was finally approved by the DBT, and the Bio-Safety Level 3 (BSL 3) Cabinet was fabricated in just 3 months with room enough for an assembly of 18 students to work in it at once... And they went on to make history as it was the first time a lab had done a genome-wide screening manually by individual researchers. Harvard University listed it as one of the most innovative papers that it had ever screened.

We then performed the same genome-wide screening in the Multi-Drug Resistant (MDR) and the Extensively Drug Resistant (XDR) strains to know which proteins are critical- no matter what the adaptive divergence is- based on the difference in strain or phenotype. And it was thus that we finally made our way to drug research. We have a candidate molecule which has been cleared in the pre-clinical trials and we are in talks for doing in vivo research and going for the Phase I trials. We are now being funded by the Wellcome Trust.

We are starting a new initiative in a completely different disease- Diabetes. And before TB, we used to work on B cells to see how B cell memory is formed. And even before that was the research on peptide vaccines. So I have worked in diverse research areas- and doing different things is one way to stay young too... (smiles)

- AKC: Thank you for that detailed description of your research. Coming to India, where do you think it stands in the worldwide scene in the context of research in Medical Biology?
- KVS: Honestly speaking, India has a lot to catch up with the rest of the world, which is working at a breakneck speed. There are delays in research in India- and it is of systemic nature.. Because by the time you write a project and get a grant, and then get the money, it is already at least 1-1.5 years..... I know this as I have chaired some committees in the DBT.... and it is dispiriting to see how long some research groups have to wait for the grant money that has been sanctioned to them. It has happened to my lab at ICGEB too.
- AKC: Indian students do excellent work when they are in positions in Universities, institutes, etc, out of India and are acclaimed for that. What do you think that stops them from performing similar level of work
- **KVS:** Indian students are some of the brightest in the world.. but I think there are two basic problems with most of them:
- 1. They often come with a lack of confidence
- The Indian education culture is a lot about memorizing stuff and not much about raising critical questions to Professors on the subjects taught.
- AKC: Drawing a reference to the theme of this International Conference, what are your views on transforming the inherent medicinal value of the rich and unique plant resources of this region?
- **KVS:** It has to be done soon, and on a priority basis. We have this potentially rich biodiversity... and for too long it stays potentially rich- it is not translated to real riches. Every other country is moving fast in scientific research-I was in China in January, and they have invested the last ten years in realizing their plant resources, and in another 5 years, the entire Traditional Chinese Medicine (TCM) compounds will be characterized down to the last molecule. And people are interested in potent herbal medicine the world over...TCM is already edging out Ayurveda in terms of exposure, and if it is commercialized and comes to market, there will hardly be any room left for our herbal medicines.. So we either wake up now, or it will be too late.
- AKC: In Assam, the OIL industry was set up soon after Oil and Gas were discovered here, and the tea industry came up as soon as the beverage value of Tea was realized.. So what is stopping Pharmaceutical companies to set up their labs here despite the rich plant diversity of medicinal value here?
- **KVS:** My personal opinion about the Pharmaceutical Industry in India is that it is a fairly unimaginative one- they are mostly just tinkering with already known molecules to get new ones and making a few million rupees off them. But even otherwise strong Pharma industries build products on well-established traditional herbal medicines.. And this is the Roadmap that I have been discussing with the Vice Chancellor of Dibrugarh University..... If you have a


pipeline of strong validations, strong characterizations of traditional medicine, and can do the manufacturing in a community-based cottage industry model-keeping the Intellectual Property Rights intact, I believe that will be a fantastic. And that will spread across communities and will be a terrific thing.

AKC: Why do you think the Industry-Academia interfacing is not quite happening here in our country unlike that in the US, or other developed countries?

KVS: That will only happen in the true sense of the term when Industry can fund Academia. And no Indian industry has the pocket depth to do that.... and that is the problem. So the little Industry-Academia interfacing happening here is through public funding, or the public-private-partnership (PPP) model. It is not like in abroad where you find the major Pharma companies put 100 million dollars in MIT (Massachusetts Information Institute of Technology) or 50 million dollars in Harvard as private fund for research as they see innovation there... Leads will come from there. In India, we the scientists and researchers have not developed the credibility to compete for funds from multinational companies and the Indian Pharma industry does not have the imagination for this type of collaboration. Cipla has become quite big now, and Sun Pharma is big too... so hopefully they will start investing on new hopes and novel ideas in research. But it is still the Government funded Private Public Partnership models which are the norm now...everybody just comes for the pot of gold than focus on any real research.

AKC: What would be your advice be to our young science students and researchers?

KVS: I think the mistake we make here in India is that everything good is only good if it is serious... Science too therefore has to be a serious business but in fact it is not a serious business... it is a lot of fun actually- playing with ideas... seeing what works and what not. Where else would you really get paid for playing with ideas? As long as you enjoy what you do, I think even the frustration and challenges of getting the funds for your research would feel justified... But you have to have fun in doing research.

Prof. P.M. Rajan Gurukkal, Former Vice Chancellor, Mahatma Gandhi University, Kottayam has delivered a talk on the topic "Development, Ethnicity and Environment: A Theoretical Perspective" on the third Golden Jubilee Colloquium of Dibrugarh University on 3rd November, 2014. The Scholar and historian of eminence, Prof. Gurukkal delivered an engrossing discourse on divered themes of development, ethnicity and environment. The independent yet intimately related themes merged into one another as Prof. Gurukkal elaborated on the relevance of the theme. Development as he portrays as the descriptive connotation to cover the capital

Eminent modern poet in Malayalam, a bilingual critic, playwright, editor, literary columnist, translator and the recipient of Sahitya Academi Award, Dr. K Satchidanandan delivered a thought provoking talk on "Indian Literature: Singular or Plural?" at Fourth Dibrugarh University Golden Jubilee Colloquium on 16 December 2014. Dr. Satchidanandan states that instead of reducing the polemic into an all-conclusive dictum, it is rather pertinent to problematize the entire issue so as to view it from different vantage points.



Dr. Satchidanandan asserts that plurality is the essential feature of Indian literature, however, nonetheless there are certain commonalities within it which facilitated the grand tradition of Indian literature. While cementing his argument on the topic the noted poet critic takes into account some of the observation of other critics and commentators on Indian literature. For instance, he refers to the stance that Indian literature is one even though it is written in different languages. On the contrary to this there is another theoretical orientation to the issue is that there cannot be a single Indian literature as there is not an 'Indian language'. In this regard he also points to the fact that the richness of oral tradition has also problematized the question of 'singularity'.




Lectures on Tai language and Culture

The Third Conference on Rock Deformation and Structures (RDS- III) was organized in the Department of Applied Geology, Dibrugarh University from October 29-30, 2014. RDs-III turned out to a huge success as it is well attended by structural geologists working in different fields both in academics and industry. About 150 participants from different Universities, IITs, organizations like Geological Survey of India, Research Centers and industries like ONGC, OIL, NHPC, NEIST, Hindustan Zinc Limited etc., presented their research findings. The conference provided the proper stage especially for the young researchers to present and share their findings and to interact with very experienced structural geologists of India. Right from the initial stages greater emphasis was given to the poster presentations which came to be a grand success. About 70 posters and 25 oral presentations were presented covering a wide spectrum of the subject with a special emphasis on modern developments and techniques. An abstract volume was published along with the Conference which contains 110 abstracts including abstracts form foreign countries like Italy, Germany,

Iran etc. The entire technical sessions were divided into three themes: Tectonics of NE India with a special emphasis on hydrocarbon exploration, kinematic and dynamic analysis of structures in rocks and applied aspects of structural geology: geotechnical engineering and mineral exploration. It is worth mentioning that response of the participants and level of interactions during presentations in all these sessions were very scintillating. Each session was started with a key note speech by a revered geologist of the country. The Conference was inaugurated by Prof. D. Nath, Vice-Chancellor- in-charge. Dibrugarh University pays rich tribute to its former Chancellor

I.B. Patnaik

The Dibrugarh University Community paid rich tribute to Late Janaki Ballabh Patnaik who breathed his last at Tirupati on 21st April, 2015. Late J. B. Patnaik was the Chancellor of the University during 2009-2014, and was the former Governor of Assam. Professor Alak K Buragohain, the Vice-Chancellor of Dibrugarh University, who presided over the condolence meeting recollected his personal association with Late J.B Patnaik and stated that Patnaik had an enormous personality with rare qualities of humanism. He stated that J.B Patnaik was not only a Politician Statesmen with outstanding qualities but also was a great scholar and litterateur. Professor



Pramathesh Bhattacharyya in his speech pointed out that amongst the many memorable works done by Shri J.B Patnaik a few stand out remarkably— his initiative in making the Kirtan Ghar at Barpeta open for the women folk, and his great contribution and leadership in creating a spiritual centre for all religion at the Jagannath Temple in Dibrugarh. Late Patnaik was an exceptionally erudite person, who wrote some wonderful books in Odia. A great scholar in Sanskrit, he won the Kendriya Sahitya Akademi for his Odia translation of Bankim Chandra's collected novels in 2001 and the Odisha Sahitya Akademi award for his translation of Bhartrihari's Bairaqya Shataka in 1996.



Prof. Amalendu Guha

Prof. Amalendu Guha, who passed away on 7 May, 2015 will be ever remembered for his encyclopaedic breath of scholarship and visionary intellectual vigour. Prominent Marxist historian, economist, poet and a litterateur from Assam - Amalendu Guha's two masterpieces Planter-Raj to Swaraj: Freedom Struggle and Electoral Politics in Assam 1826-1947(1977) and Medieval and Early Colonial Assam: Society, Polity, Economy (1991) not only mark the contextualisation of the discourse of freedom struggle at the backdrop of

Assam, but at the same time both the works, perhaps for the first time, disseminate the dispassionate intent and theoretical orientation of historiography in writing history of Assam.

Born on January 30, 1924 in Imphal, Manipur Prof. Guha completed his MA from Presidency College. He started his teaching career at Darrang College, Tezpur and later he taught at Gokhale institute of Politics and Economics, Pune and thereafter at Delhi School of Economics. His PhD thesis was on "Economic Transition in Afganistan: 1917-63". He had also worked as a Professor of History at the Centre for Studies in Social Sciences, Calcutta, and was a member of both the Indian Council of Social Science Research and the Indian Council of Historical Research. He got involved in active left politics at the age of 14 as a high school student when he joined the All India Students' Federation

(Assam unit) in 1938/39, also around that time he started his engagement with Marxist study club "Progressive Union".

A staunch follower of left democratic movements in Assam, Prof. Guha was mostly known as a historian in mainland India. His contributions and presence in the field of poetry and literature are also immense. He presided over the History Conclave and Poetry Convention of Axom Sahitya Sabha in 1978 and 1994 respectively. Among his many other writings in Assamese and Bengali, his incisive travelogue on Afghanistan 'Afghantistanot Ebhumuki' (A Glance into Afghanistan) published in 1961 is considered to be one of the classics in Assamese travel writing.

Despite publishing only two anthologies of poetry, Prof. Guha is counted among the most prominent modern poets of Assam. He has earned his place in the annals of Assamese literature as the poet of social consciousness, human sufferings and aspirations. His first anthology, called Luit Parer Gatha (in Bengali) was published in 1955 followed by his second anthology, *Tomaloi* (in Assamese) published in 1960. Both these anthologies are resplendent tribute to Assam and the struggles and aspirations of its people.

He was honoured with the Sahityacharya Sanman of the Asam Sahitya Sabha, Asom Prakashan Parishad Award, Aniruddhadev Chair Award of Dibrugarh University among others. We offer our sincere tribute Prof. Guha with a conviction that in the academic and cultural arena his aura as a great scholar and a champion of the poor and the underprivileged will persist in the days to come.
